

 <p>Alb Ankle length robe worn under the chasuble.</p>	 <p>Chalice Sacred vessel used for the consecration of wine/Precious Blood.</p>	 <p>Sanctuary Lamp Usually red, it is placed in the sanctuary of a church. When lit, it indicates the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.</p>
 <p>Ciborium A chalice-like vessel used to contain the Blessed Sacrament.</p>	 <p>Bishop Gerald Barnes Leads and guides the Diocese of San Bernardino, of which St. Catherine of Siena in Rialto belongs.</p>	 <p>Auxiliary Bishop Rutilio del Riego Assists Bishop Barnes in leading the Diocese of San Bernardino.</p>
